The Prospect Section Committee of the Communist Party, at its meeting on Oct. 28, unanimously expelled Sylvia Price, her two sisters, Eileen Rechtman and Bea Rechtman, Jerry Schwartz and seven others for organizing and maintaining a faction within the P.R. club and carrying on disruptive anti-party activities of a left-wing sectarian, semi-Trotzkyist nature in opposition to the line of the Communist Party.

This faction was organized several months ago. The center of this faction are members of the Price family, headed by Earl Price, who was expelled by the party several months ago as a petty bourgeois inwho propagated semidividualist Trotzkyist views and maintained connections with an outside antiparty group. The faction tried to enlist new members of the party into its ranks, carried on a campaign of hostility and enmity to the party

It used the club paper to spread its own line as against that of the party.

> When charges of breaches of discipline were preferred against them, the members of this faction, seeing that the club was opposed to them and that their goose was cooked, refused to come to hearings and face the charges. Instead, it rushed into the open and on Oct. 24 issued and distributed publicly a long printed circular. This circular slanderously distorts the party policy of struggle against American imperialism and its political representatives, the GOP and the Truman Administration. Speaking in the language of outsiders, even before their expulsion t ookplace, they not only denounced the party's policy but sank to the low level of accusing the party itself of "betraying the working class to the bourgeoisie," and also betraying "its brother parties and peoples throughout the world."

> They disavow the elections of our last national convention and appeal to members to organize an opposition in the party, promised further publications, and call for names, funds and supporters for its miserable attempt to organize what it calls a "Marxist" party. Thus we are dealing here with a little clique of outright disrupters and factionalists. The publication and spreading of this circular is not only an attack upon the party, but also provides alanderous material to reaction—the desperate and criminal act of irresponsible people who are alien to the interests of the working class and the Communist movement.

> Stripped of its camouflage, evasiveness and double meanings—the program of this faction, as expressed in its club discussions, private talks and its published circular, amounts to the following:

This faction eppeses the Party line of struggle against American importation, which is to defeat the

aims of American imperialism to dominate the world and to impose term peace. This faction, however, abandons the fight for peace, regarding war as immediately inevitable. It overestimates the power of American imperialism and underestimates the possibilities of a broad and successful fight for and has been spreading a spirit of defeatism calculated to narrow and weaken the fight against American imperialist reaction.

In combatting reaction and the danger of fascism, the Party has been resolutely fighting against the reactionary trend of the Truman Administration, its reactionary anti-labor actions, its surrender of the Roosevelt policies, its bipartisan imperialist foreign policy, at the same time conducting a vigorous struggle against the spearhead of reaction represented by the GOP and tory Democrats. This faction, however, has made the Truman Administration the exclusive and main center of attack. It has exaggerated the degree of fascist development in the U.S.A. erroneously considering the Truman Administration as virtually a fascist government.

By its exaggeration that the Truman Administration is virtually a fascist government, and by its onesided attacks on the Democratic Party, this faction diverts attention from the danger of the main centers of reaction, represented by the Hoover-Dewey Republicans, lessens the fight against this camp and thus, despite all its shouting about the fascist danger, in fact weakens the fight against this danger. On the basis of a false and alarmist analysis of the situation, it denounced the National Committee during the summer for failure to call for a nationwile political strike against the Case Bill-a tactic which could lead only to the islolation of the Party from the progressive labor movement.

It is not at all accidental that despite the Party's criticism made at the club, this grouplet in the election campaign kept silent about the dangers of a Dewey Republican victory, did nothing to arouse the people against it, paid little attention to the building up of an ALP vote while contenting itself with attacks upon the Mcad-Lehman Democrats as the chief feature of its activities.

In the same way it opposes the policy of the Party of building a o broad anti-monopoly and anti-imperialist coalition, which is directed to achieving a political realignment, and the establishment of a people's third party. Instead it advocates a course calculated to lead to narrow splinter groupings which under the false label of a third party would in fact doom the possibility of unity of the advanced forces in the labor and progressive movement fighting for a third party with other progressive forces in this direction to

While pretending to advance the vanguard role of the Party and talking big about "action," this faction made not the slightest effort in its neighborhood, which consist overwhelmingly of proletarians, to develop any action around mass issues, including that of the struggle against the high cost of living.

It fights against the principle of democratic centralism by means of which the party achieves the greatest degree of democracy, united action and discipline. Under cover of the right to criticize, this group has been attempting to establish in the party the right to build factions, the right to disrupt and the right to destroy the discipline of the
