Dear Comrades,

I am writing on behalf of Solidarity's national coordinators, to let you know about a decision we took earlier this week that I hope will interest you. Since last May, Solidarity has taken regroupment as one of its main priorities. We have been exploring possibilities for unity with the Socialist Party, the International Socialists and Workers' Power, as well as local socialist-feminist groups such as the Buffalo Women's Liberation Union. These explorations are continuing. At the same time, we have now decided, we would like to explore possibilities for unity with people coming out of the Marxist-Leninist party-building tradition who share some of our politics. We are trying to make contacts with the Guardian collective and various independent local groups; but I feel that Theoretical Review, more than anyone else in the party-building tradition, has posed a clear alternative to the directions taken by OCIC and Line of March.

I am enclosing the resolution on regroupment adopted at our recent winter conferences, as well as a brochure laying out our politics and work. I hope you can decide on the basis of these whether further discussions with us might be fruitful. Such discussions could continue as written exchanges; or members and friends of Solidarity and TR could meet to talk in areas where both live (New York, Boston, Los Angeles or the San Francisco Bay Area).

We look forward to hearing from you.
