REVOLUTIONARY ALLIANCES SET UP IN KIANCSI Nanchang, NCNA, 5 December 1967

In order to propagate Chairman Mao's latest instructions to the revolutionary masses at the basic level as quickly as possible, the Preparatory Committee for the Provincial Revolutionary Committee of Kiangsi has set up Mao Tse-tung's thought propaganda teams based on the "three-way alliance."

An upsurge in the living study and application of Chairman Mao's latest instructions has been brought about among the revolutionary masses in both the cities and the countryside as a result of the work done by these teams which comprise leading members of proletarian revolutionary organisations, revolutionary leading cadres and commanders and fighters of army units which are supporting the Left.

The teams hold all manner of meetings everywhere — in market places, at street corners, in the fields and in people's homes, and use all media to spread the instructions, such as big-character posters, blackboards, loud-speakers, etc.

They faithfully disseminate Chairman Mao's latest instructions to the masses without delay. They join the revolutionary masses in studying relevant documents on the great proletarian cultural revolution and explain the excellent situation and the fierce struggle between the proletariat and the bourgeoisie, between socialism and capitalism and between the revolutionary line represented by Chairman Mao and the bourgeois reactionary line represented by China's Marushchev.

As elsewhere, the agents of China's Khrushchev in Kiangsi Province used to block the spread of Mao Tse-tung's thought. Even in the early period of the cultural revolution, the handful of Party persons in authority taking the capitalist road withheld Chairman Mao's many instructions on the great proletarian cultural revolution from the masses.

Soon after the propaganda teams publicised Chairman Mao's call to bring about a revolutionary great alliance, a high tide of revolutionary great alliance swept the province. Within a short period, the revolutionary masses in all the six administrative regions and in more than 90 percent of the <u>hsien</u> in the province realised a revolutionary great alliance.

As in other provinces where the proletarian revolutionaries have seized power from the handful of Party persons in authority taking the



the capitalist road, the Preparatory Committee for the Provincial Revolutionary Committee of Kiangsi has placed the propagation of Chairman Mao's instructions at the top of its agenda. It does this work most resolutely with high enthusiasm, at high speed and on the widest scale.

When the Preparatory Committee learnt of the series of the instructions Chairman Mao had issued during his inspection tour of North, Central South and East China, all its members went to the basic levels to take our great leader's teachings to the masses.

The experience of the Preparatory Committee once more proves that Chairman Mao's words are of the highest order, they constitute the highest authority and are most powerful, and that every sentence of Chairman Mao's carries more weight than ten thousand other sentences.

"Three-way alliance" Mao Tse-tung's thought propaganda teams have also been set up in the <u>hsien</u>. These <u>hsien</u> teams penetrate even more deeply among the masses. They go into the mountains and to remote hamlets to take Chairman Mao's instructions to the peasants.
