COMMITTEE MEMBER BEHAVIOR DECIDED IN WUHAN

[Text] Under the brilliant leadership and care of Chairman Mao and his closest comrade in arms, Vice Chairman Lin, Hupeh was achieved decisive victory in the great proletarian cultural revolution. We have won back the party, government, financial and cultural powers from a handful of party persons in authority taking the capitalist road, headed by Wag Jen-chung, the agent of China's Khrushchev in Hupeh.

In order to win total victory in the great proletarian cultural revolution, consolidate the dictatorship of the proletariat, and prevent a restoration of capitalism, the revolutionary committee must raise high the great red banner of Mao Tse-tung's thought, give prominence to proletarian politics, follow closely Chairman Mao's great strategic plan, and thoroughly implement Chairman Mao's latest instructions.

The members of the revolutionary committee must always be loyal to Chairman Mao, be infinitely loyal to Mao Tse-tung's thought, and be absolutely loyal to Chairman Mao's proletarian revolutionary line. They must take the lead in studying and applying Mao Tse-tung's thought creatively, combat self-interest and repudiate revisionism, make revolution in the depths of their souls, seriously reform their world view, and be revolutionized in thinking, work, work style, and daily life. They must appear as common laborers, serve the people wholeheartedly, resolutely oppose privileges, and resolutely oppose all work styles divorced from the masses. We therefore issue the following decisions:

1--Members of the revolutionary committee must make big efforts to study and apply Chairman Mao's works creatively, regarding the "five much-read articles" as maxims. First, they must study and apply well Chairman Mao's latest instructions. They must make a habit and a system of study, persisting in studying for one hour every day, and holding two three-day collective study sessions every month.

2--Members of the revolutionary committee are servants of the people. They cannot act as mandarins. Members of the standing committee must take turns on duty. One week every month, they must handle problems in the revolutionary committee; for the rest of time, they must plue into the basic levels to propagate Chairman Mao's latest instructions and party policies and principles, take part in work and physical labor, conduct investigation, listen to the views and criticism of the masses, and report conditions to the revolutionary committee in good time.

3--Members of the revolutionary committee must give prominence to proletarian politics, persist in the "four firsts," and promote the "three-eight" work style. They must act in a lively and vigorous way, oppose "passing the buck" and inertia, and strengthen revolutionary sense of responsibility.

4--Members of the revolutionary committee must, in work, follow closely the party Central Committee, headed by our great supreme commander, Chairman Mao. They must make reports which seek advice, and not reckon themselves omniscient. They must seriously implement the mass line, and consult more with the masses, in the spirit of being their little pupils. They must assign certain times for personally receiving visits from the masses and deal personally with letters from the masses.

5--Members of the revolutionary committee must seriously combat self-interest and repudiate revisionism, strengthen proletarian party spirit, and get rid of bourgeois and petty-bourgeois factionalism. They must learn from each other and help, cherish, and support each other, go all out to strengthen the unity of the leadership core of the revolutionary committee under the principles of Mao Tsetung's thought, and defend the authority of the revolutionary committee.

6--Members of the revolutionary committee are not to be welcomed or seen off when attending mass rallies, nor, in general, should their names be reported at the rallies. They are not to be photographed by individuals or appear in films. It is forbidden to extol the merits and sing the praises of members of the revolutionary committee.

7--Members of the revolutionary committee must strengthen their revolutionary and scientific sense and organizational discipline. Before problems have been collectively discussed and agreed on, they may not go around making speeches on behalf of the revolutionary committee. Their speeches may not be recorded or printed without approval from the revolutionary committee.

8--Members of the revolutionary committee must maintain and carry forward an austere work style and resolutely oppose extravagance and waste. They may not use a state car for private pruposes, and must pay attention to thrift when they use a car for public purposes.

9--Members of the revolutionary committee may not send gifts in their own name or accept gifts from others.

10--The revolutionary committee is to hold a minor rectification of work styles every three months, at which, taking Chairman Mao's latest instruction as the key link and the "five much-read articles" as the weapon, criticism and self-criticism is to be conducted, experiences summed up, shortcomings got rid of, and work improved. In accordance with the contents and requirements of this rectification, representatives of a certain number of mass organizations can be invited to attend.
