[Text] Peking--A citywide alliance of workers in Wuhan, and an alliance of two factions among revolutionary mass organizations in Honan Province, have been brought about as the result of study courses of Mao Tse-tung's thought. This alliance will facilitate the formation of the revolutionary committee, the provisional organ of power.

The formation of the revolutionary committee, a product of the current great proletarian cultural revolution, requires an alliance of local proletarian revolutionaries and a leadership of the three-way alliance type made up of representatives of revolutionary mass organizations, revolutionary leading cadres, and leading members of the People's Liberation Army units stationed in the locality.

In Wuhan, the door to this committee was opened when the 300,000 workers of the city started several thousand study courses in Mao Tse-tung's thought in factories, workshops, and residential areas. Taking Chairman Mao's call to "fight self, repudiate revisionism" and their guide, they studied Chairman Mao's works to revolutionize their own thinking, and to uproot from their minds the ideological stumbling block of factionalism.

In Honan Province, differences of minor issues had led to the divisions although the mass organizations had the same general orientation, that of repudiating China's Khrushchev and the handful of capitalist-roaders. A study course arranged jointly by the preparatory group for the Honan provincial revolutionary committee, and the party committee of the provincial military command helped the leading members of both factions to repudiate bourgeois and petty-bourgeois factionalism and to establish the proletarian party spirit. As a result, the two factions have formed a great alliance committee to help implement details under the preparatory group for the Honan provincial revolutionary committee.
