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FOREWORD TO THE SECOND EDITION

The treacherous war waged by "Israel" on the 5th June 1967, against the Arab States was in accordance with the Zionist Expansionist policy which has for its goal the establishment, step by step, of a Zionist Empire. This surprise attack resulted in the Israeli occupation of the West Bank of the Jordan, the Gaza Strip, the Sinai Desert and the Golan Heights of Syria. But this was not all. Jerusalem was also proclaimed to be part of "Israel"; Christian and Moslem Holy Places came under Israeli domination; one million more Arabs were subjugated under Zionist occupation and oppression and 400,000 more Palestinian Arab refugees were added to the list of the one million and a half formerly expelled by Zionist terror and massacre in 1948.

The barbaric methods used by the Israelis in 1967 to evict the Palestinian Arabs from their homes and homeland were similar to the barbaric methods used in 1948. The only difference between the two criminal drives was that the Israeli army in 1967 took the place of the Hagana, Irgun Zvai Leumi and Stern terrorists gangs who had committed the massacres of Deir Yassin, Beit El-Khoury and others in 1948. It is because of these similarities in the crime that we see fit to issue again this pamphlet with an addendum, which deals with these evictions and puts on record the darkest page in Jewish Zionist history.

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INTRODUCTION

In our last pamphlet "The Activities of the Hagana," we published the "British Command Paper No. 6873" of 1946, which was an official record of the atrocious acts of the three "Jewish illegal para-military organizations" in Palestine: the Hagana, the Irgun Zvai Leumi, and the Stern gangs, which "engaged in carefully planned movements of sabotage and violence under the guise of the "Jewish Resistance Movement."

In this British Government Command Paper, only a part of the violence and sabotage was recorded. To remind our readers, the Statement ended in the following conclusion:

"The evidence contained in the foregoing pages is not, and is not intended to be a complete statement of all the evidence in the possession of His Majesty's Government. Nor are the specific instances herein referred to by any means a complete list of all incidents of violence and sabotage which have taken place in recent months.

The fact is that in the first six months of 1946 there were nearly fifty separate incidents involving violence and in many cases loss of life; material damage to a very great extent has been done to railway installations, police and R.A.F. stations, and coastguard stations. Roads have been mined and vehicles have been blown up.

The above operations were so widespread in character and caused very extensive damage. When they were almost immediately followed by the kidnapping of British officers, it was no longer possible for His Majesty's Government to adopt a passive attitude. Unless the Government were prepared to yield to threats of violence and to abandon all hope of establishing law and order, they were bound to take steps against any persons or organizations who had made themselves responsible for the **planning and carrying out of the outrages which are dealt with in this paper.**"

However, disgracefully, His Majesty's Government yielded to Zionist threats and violence and surrendered to the Jewish terrorists as we shall see later. The terrorists continued their campaign of horror and with the consent of the British Government, chased the Palestinian Arabs out of their ancestral homes while the British troops, hands up, looked on.

The following is a brief account of this heart-rending tragedy.

**THE EXPULSION OF THE PALESTINE ARABS

A DARK PAGE IN JEWISH HISTORY**

To give a full account of the "expulsion" of the Palestine Arabs from their homes and homeland by the Jewish terrorists, will need a large volume which will tell the story of how the Jewish people of the twentieth century were, pathetically, misled by the militant Zionist Movement, and emotionally carried away to participate in one of the most outrageous massacres of our time, and thus write the "darkest page in Jewish history."

It is indeed the supreme tragedy of the Jewish people of this century, that their persecution by the different nations throughout the ages until the fall of the Third Reich in 1945, was not able to teach them the eternal truth that "unless the Lord," not the sword, "buildeth the house, the builder buildeth but in vain," and that, "he who taketh up the sword shall perish by the sword." Thus, in building what they call the state of Israel in Palestine, the Zionist Jews resorted to wholesale atrocities and massacres, terrorizing the Arab inhabitants of Palestine to flee their homes for their lives. Over one million Arab refugees are now in destitution suffering exile at the hands of those who brutally expelled them from their homes. And yet, the conscience of world Jewry, except for the few members of the "American Council for Judaism," "The Third Force Movement" in Israel and some others, is un-moved by these atrocious acts, and is, callously and surprisingly, unperturbed that the day of reckoning, sooner or later, must arrive.

This pamphlet will not, in any way, be a complete account on the subject, but it will answer millions of people who want to know the truth. The distorted and misleading novel and its movie picture, "Exodus," which make of assassins heroes, has urged us all the more to tell the story in brief in accordance with our motto, "ye shall know the truth and the truth shall make you free."

MISLEADING ZIONIST PROPAGANDA

It is to be expected that the Zionists will not incriminate themselves and give the true reasons why the Palestine Arabs fled their homes and homeland, because the actual cause which slowly penetrated the thick Zionist propaganda barrage, placed the Jews on a level with the Nazis. The atrocities committed by the Nazis against the Jews in the Second World War, were, most unfortunately, imitated by the Zionist Jews against the Palestine Arabs in 1948; and the atrocities which the Jews suffered at the hands of the Nazis were identical with the atrocities which the Arabs of Palestine suffered at the hands of the Jews, if not in quantity, but certainly in quality.

The Zionist Jews, led by the Jewish Agency, covered up their evil deeds in Palestine by misinformation and distortions. Their propaganda machinery, the most efficient in the world, was meticulously put into operation to obscure the truth. They succeeded for a long time. Whenever they found themselves in trouble and the truth was leaking out, they used their sharpest weapon which they carefully made up. The word, "anti-Semitic," established by them to sound so inhuman and sinful, has surrounded the Zionists with a "Halo of Safety" against all attacks of whatever crimes they have so far committed. The threat of the use of this word against many an honest historian, reporter, government official, businessman, or politician, has made their victims kneel before them pleading for mercy.

MEN OF INTEGRITY AND COURAGE

The world at large would have never known why the Palestine Arabs fled their homes and homeland, had it not been for the honesty and courage of a few men of great integrity, foremost of whom are the British historian Arnold Toynbee, Prof. Millar Burrows, Prof. William Ernest Hocking, the late Dorothy Thompson

and many others. Although in his book, "A Study of History," Arnold Toynbee gave an account of how the Zionist terrorists expelled the Arabs of Palestine from their ancestral homes by brutal force, Zionist propaganda was able, for many years, to obscure the

truth and deceive the world. It is because of this very fact that we see fit to write on this subject today, thirteen years after the tragedy had taken place. So thick was the cloud created by Zionist distortion to cover up Zionist atrocities in the Palestine conflict of 1948, that when the truth was publicly exposed by Arnold Toynbee at McGill University in Montreal, Canada, in January, 1961, this expose, not only staggeringly shocked world Jewry, but also the conscience of the whole world.

ZIONIST TERROR AND CALCULATED MASSACRE

The Palestine Arabs fled their homes and homeland because of "Zionist Terror" and "Calculated Massacre." They were expelled by the Hagana, the Irgun Zvei Leumi and the Stern gangs, the illegal well-armed Jewish para-military organizations, sponsored and financed by the Jewish Agency in Palestine.

To cover up their crimes, the Zionists made up false reasons for the Arab flight some of which are the following:

1. That the Palestine Arabs left their country of their own free will.
2. That they were encouraged by their leaders to leave.
3. That their exodus was the result of the war between the Arab States and Israel.

These allegations were given the widest publicity by the Jewish and pro-Jewish press, by Zionist leaders and year after year by Israeli representatives in the United Nations. They were brought forward and emphasized, not only to cover up Israeli crimes and atrocities, but, pervertedly, as an excuse for the refusal of the Israeli aggressors to return Arab refugees to their homes.

NO REASON DEPRIVES ARAB REFUGEES FROM RETURNING HOME

While all these allegations are false, they do not, even if they were true, deprive the Arabs of Palestine of the right of return to their homes and homeland. Why the Palestinian Arab left his home—whether from fear of being murdered by Irgun assassins or of his own free will or from any other cause—has no bearing on his right of return. No German or Japanese was prevented from returning to Germany or Japan, simply because, during the war, he left his country voluntarily or because of fear or because his leaders advised him to leave.

Indeed, the Arabs of Palestine did not leave their country voluntarily, but were driven out of their homes, their farms, their place of work, their mosques and churches and schools. They were, virtually, thrown into the desert under the blazing sun and the extreme cold, without food or shelter.

*ATROCITIES OF THE THREE TERRORIST BANDS

The operations of these illegal Jewish terrorists gangs from the year 1944 and thereafter, were most brutal and savage. They were all-out Zionist attacks on Arab towns and villages with the sole object of terrorizing the Arab population out of their homes and homeland according to plan. At one place, the terrorists would slaughter a whole village as in Deir Yassin or in Nassridin or in Beit-El-Khour; and in other localities, they would simply kill a few here and there to keep the people in panic, running.

To list all the atrocities committed by the Jewish terrorists would not be possible. They run in the hundreds. There were more unknown than known, as we shall see later. However, the bombing of the King David Hotel in Jerusalem on the 26th of July 1947,

where 101 Government officials of all creeds were killed beneath the rubble; the bombing of the Semiramis Hotel also in Jerusalem, where 22 Arabs, including women and children, met similar fate; the hanging of British soliders on trees; the attack on the Arab village of Deir Yassin on the 9th of April 1948, where 250 men, women and children were brutally murdered in cold blood; the attack on Beit El-Khouri and adjacent Arab villages on the 6th of May 1948, where a great number were killed and hundreds wounded by machine guns; the attack on Nassriddin village near Tiberias with machine guns and hand grenades, killing all the population of the village except 40 women and children who escaped to the neighboring villages; the attempted murder of the High Commissioner for Palestine and his wife near Kalonia, three miles west of Jerusalem; the assassination of Lord Moyne, British Minister of State in Cairo; the kidnapping of British Officers, the rolling of barrels of explosives into Arab suqs (markets) in Haifa, Jaffa and Jerusalem, killing as many as a hundred at a time; the attack on Beit Darras village, near Gaza, where the whole village was exterminated; the bombing of Arab buildings and private houses in Jerusalem, Jaffa and Haifa, are only examples of these atrocities.

In addition, leaflets were dropped from the air in Galilee signed by the "Hagana Commander in Galilee" which said among other things, "I declare in this communique that all people who do not want this war, must leave together with their women and children in order to be safe. This is going to be a cruel war with no mercy or compassion. There is no reason why you should endanger yourselves."

TOYNBEE RECORDS SOME OF THESE ATROCITIES

The authority to support our accusation is no less than the greatest historian of our time, Arnold Toynbee. In his book "A Study of History," he states the following:

"The evil deeds committed by the Zionist Jews against the Palestinian Arabs that were comparable to crimes committed against the Jews by the Nazis, were the massacre of men, women and children at Dair Yasin on the 9th of April, 1948, which precipitated a flight of the Arab population in large numbers from districts within range of the Jewish armed forces and the subsequent deliberate expulsion of the Arab population from districts conquered by the Jewish forces between the 15th of May, 1948 and the end of the year i.e. from Akka in May, from Lydda and Ramleh in July, and from Beersheba and Western Galilee in October . . . The Arab blood on the 9th of April, 1948 at Dair Yasin was on the head of the Irgun; the expulsions after the 15th of May, 1948, were on the heads of all Israel."

From this short statement, the following conclusions can be made:


1. That the crimes committed by the Zionist Jews against the Arabs of Palestine were comparable to the crimes committed against the Jews by the Nazis.

2. That these crimes perpetrated against the Arabs of Palestine, precipitated a flight of the Arab population in large numbers from districts within range of the Jewish criminal forces.

3. That this flight seriously began on the 9th of April 1948, the date of the Deir Yassin Massacre, when British troops were still in Palestine and five weeks before one Arab soldier set foot in Palestine.

4. That there were **Subsequent deliberate expulsions** of the Arab population by the Israeli authorities, after the 15th of May, 1948, and after the British left Palestine.

5. That the innocent Arab blood spilt before the 15th of May, 1948, is on the head of the Jewish terrorist gangs, and the Arab blood spilt after the 15th of May 1948, is on the heads of all Israel.

THE JEWS HAVE NOT LEARNED THEIR LESSON

But the great historian goes further than that. Not only does he strongly condemn the expulsion of the Palestine Arabs from their homes by the Jews, but considers it more appalling than all previous expulsions, due to the fact that the Jews who had suffered so much atrocity at the hands of Nebuchadnessar, Titus, Hadrian, etc., and the Nazis, should have, in the historian's opinion, learned their lesson and should have refrained from imitating

their persecutors. This is what Arnold Toynbee says in this connection as found in "A Study of History"!

" . . . The Jews had even less excuse in A.D. 1948 for evicting Palestinian Arabs from their homes than Nebuchadnessar and Titus, and Hadrian and the Spanish and Portugese Inquisition had had. In A.D. 1948, the Jews knew from personal experience what they were doing; and it was their supreme tragedy that the lesson learned by them from their encounter with the Nazi Gentiles should have been, not to eschew, but to imitate some of the evil deeds that the Nazis committed against the Jews."

This is the verdict of the greatest historian of our time. This is his verdict against the Jewish Agency which sponsored and financed the three terrorist gangs. This is his verdict against Ben Gurion and his Government who participated in and followed up, these evil deeds. This is his verdict against the people of Israel, who, with few marked exceptions, shared the responsibility in the spilling of innocent Arab blood for no crime committed.

ARNOLD TOYNBEE FIGHTS THE BATTLE OF THE PALESTINE ARAB REFUGEE

Recently, in his debate with Yacov Herzog, Israeli Ambassador to Canada, held at McGill University, Hillel House, Montreal, on January 31st, 1961, Arnold Toynbee was very vibrant again on the subject. What he said in that debate had its repercussions all over the world stirring the conscience of all people. We feel it is relevant and essential that we quote again the learned historian, who, for many years, has been heroically fighting the battle of the Palestine Arab refugee, seeking no reward, expecting none:

" . . . What we hate in what the Germans did was that it was planned beforehand, carried out cold-bloodedly with tremendous cruelty and with a purpose. Now I am afraid, I know, that all points applied to the massacres (which in numbers do not compare, but, I think, in quality do compare with what the Nazis did) which were done by certain Israel armed forces, the Stern Gang for instance, and the Irgun."

" . . . The Jewish people have suffered murder, robbery expulsion from their homes, not just for a year or two, but for centuries, running into two thousand five hundred years, shall we say. The more experience one has of what this means, I would say the more it is morally incumbent upon one not to do the same thing again."

" . . . I have given the Jewish people a piece of what the psychologists call "shock treatment." I have said aloud in startling words I think, something that your consciences—that each of you who belongs to the Jewish community of the world—are whispering inside each of you."

" . . . So I would say: Be your own critics, which is one of the grandest things in your Jewish tradition. And so, I would leave you with your own consciences and with the existence of these

Arab refugees who now number 900,000 because many children have been born in exile."

" . . . But I would make the point that Israel has, all Israel has implicated itself, so to speak, in the results of that flight, partly flight, partly expulsion in the matter of the massacre of the Palestinian Arabs, because they have taken and held the land and the property which is legally and rightfully still that of the Arabs. Now putting it bluntly, this is robbery and I am sure it is on the Jewish conscience."

" . . . I have been in the refugee camps in the Gaza Strip and I have heard the songs that the children sing in their schools. If you wanted to see what it was like to be a Jew, say thirteen or fourteen years after Nebuchadnessar exiled the Jews, go to the Gaza Strip and you will then study the spirit and state of mind of the Arabs there . . . They are saying just the same things that the Jews felt then and continued to feel later: This is our country, we mean to return."

ANOTHER SOURCE OF INFORMATION: SIR JOHN BAGOT GLUBB

Let us read part of what Sir John Bagot Glubb, Commander of the Arab Legion in Jordan (until 1956) known as Glubb Pasha, wrote on the subject: In his book "A Soldier With The Arabs" Sir John describes the Arab flight in the following words:

"The story which Jewish publicity at first persuaded the world to accept, that the Arab refugees left voluntarily is not true. Voluntary emigrants do not leave their homes with only the clothes they stand in. People who have decided to move house do not do so in such a hurry that they lose other members of their family—husband losing sight of his wife, or parents of their children. The fact is that the majority left in panic flight, to escape massacre.

They were in fact helped on their way by occasional massacre—not of very many at a time, but just enough to keep them running. Others were encouraged to move by blows or by indecent acts.”

THE MASSACRES WERE PLANNED AND EXECUTED TO AFFECT ARAB FLIGHT

Sir Glubb Pasha goes further in his book, “A Soldier With The Arabs” to show how these atrocities and massacres were planned many months and, may be, years before, for the purpose of causing panic among the Arab population and making them flee their homes. The Jews wanted Palestine devoid of its Arab population, for they realized that their state as recommended in the United Nations partition resolution of 29th November, 1947, contained an equal number of Arab inhabitants as Jews. Not only did they want the Arab inhabitants out, but they also wanted their homes and lands to make room for the coming Jewish immigrants. They lost no time, therefore, while the British were still in Palestine, to put their plans into effect. Sir John narrates the following convincing story of these plans:

“In December 1947, a senior British Officer in the Arab Legion was one day visiting a British district commissioner in Palestine. A Jewish district officer employed under the district commissioner was also present. They were having drinks in the evening. The United Nations partition plan had recently been published. The British Officer asked the Jewish Official whether the new Jewish State would not have internal troubles, in view of the fact that the Arab inhabitants of the Jewish state would be equal in number to the Jews.

“Oh, no,” replied the Jewish Officer. “That will be fixed. A few calculated massacres will get rid of them”! The speaker was not a terrorist - he was a respectable moderate Jewish Official, employed in the Mandatory Government.”

“ . . . Later on, when the problem of the Arab refugees became a tragedy which drew the attention of the world, Jewish apologists claimed that the Arabs had voluntarily become refugees, and that they had not been driven out. It is certainly true that if the Arabs had not left, the Jewish state would have been unworkable. To what extent they were intentionally driven out by “a few calculated massacres,” no Gentile will, probably, ever know.

JON KIMCHE: ANOTHER SOURCE OF INFORMATION

Another interesting source of information is Jon Kimche, a British Jew, who paid many visits to the Middle East as correspondent for Reuters and for leading British American papers and who, later, became Editor of the Jewish Observer in London. In his book “Seven Fallen Pillars,” he writes the following:

“But the Jews were developing another tactic which as now we know, made a far greater impact on the Arab population of Palestine. Small groups of Palmach, ten or fifteen strong, marching at night, they penetrated to Arab villages far in the heart of Arab held territory. Occasionally they blew up a house occupied by an active Arab nationalist, or by foreign Arab volunteers; in other villages they confiscated arms or plastered the village with warning notices. The effect of such nightly visitations soon made themselves felt throughout the Arab hinterland. They caused great disturbances and started an Exodus from the areas lying near to Jewish districts. The Arabs began to feel unsafe, and the Arab flight from the coastal areas began to assume a general character.”



ZIONIST JEWISH TERRORISTS

Zionist terrorists belonging to the Palmach of the Hagana. Dissidents of the Hagana formed the more brutal Irgun Zvei Leumi group, and dissidents of the Irgun, constituted the most brutal Stern group.

Of the Deir Yassin massacre which enhanced Arab flight, Jon Kimche says:

“On Friday, April 9th, 1948, a commando force composed of Irguns and Stern soldiers raided the village. There was no obvious occasion for them to do so. What happened afterwards has been the subject of conflicting versions, explanations and excuses by the terrorists; but nothing they said has explained, or can explain away, the murder of some 250 innocent Arabs, among them more than a hundred women and children. No less disgusting was the subsequent publicity parade by the Irgun

of a number of poor Arab prisoners through the streets of Jerusalem."

"The massacre of Dir Yassin was the darkest stain on the Jewish record throughout all the fighting. It is historically important because it was to become the beginning of a second legend with which the terrorists sought to serve their cause and justify their deeds. Just as they claimed credit for the British decision to leave Palestine as being the result of the terrorists' attacks on British troops, so later they justified the massacre of Dir Yassin because it led to the panic flight of the remaining Arabs in the Jewish state and so lessened the Jewish casualties."

PERSONAL SOURCE OF INFORMATION

During the 6th Session of the General Assembly of the United Nations, speaking before the Ad-hoc Political Committee on the 19th of January 1952, on behalf of the Palestine Arab refugees, the writer made the following statement:

"It was indeed shocking to me to hear in the Ad-hoc Political Committee, Part A, that the Arab States were responsible for the Arab Refugee problem. It may interest the Committee to know that most of the refugees left Palestine before the Arab forces entered the country. The terror that the Stern and Irgun Zvie Leumi gangs spread in Palestine, compelled hundreds of thousands of peaceful citizens to flee for their lives. For example, in the Talbieh quarter of Jerusalem where I lived, a car traversed the peaceful streets of that quarter broadcasting an S.O.S. for the Arab population to leave their homes and go away. This was done several times. So terrified were the innocent Arabs of that quarter that they sought British Military help. The military authorities heeded their request and surrounded the whole of Talbieh with barbed wire and guarded the gates with Police, prohibiting entry thereto except by a special pass which I still have. On the 13th of May 1948, however, the barbed wire was removed and the British guard was withdrawn and the inhabitants of Talbieh moved to safer quarters within the walls of Jerusalem, and Mr. Ascarati, a Secretary of the United Nations, will remember that."

MENACHEM BEGIN: ANOTHER SOURCE OF INFORMATION

Another source of information is no other than Menachem Begin, the fuhrer of the Irgun, the organization which was responsible for the horrors of the Deir Yassin, the King David Hotel, the assassination of Count Bernadotte and his companion, and hundreds of others. In his book, "The Revolt Story of the Irgun," he writes the following:

" . . . Arabs throughout the country, induced to believe wild tales of Irgun butchery, were seized with limitless panic and

started to flee for their lives. This mass flight soon developed into a maddened uncontrollable stampede."

" . . . In the rest of the country, too, the Arabs began to flee in terror even before they clashed with Jewish forces. All the Jewish forces proceeded to advance through Haifa like a knife through butter. The Arabs began fleeing in panic shouting Deir Yassin."

Thus wrote Menachem Begin, fuhrer of the Irgun, author of the crime and member of the Knesset (Israeli Parliament) today.

The Irgun Zvei Leumi terrorist gang led by Menachem Begin, was responsible for hundreds of crimes and "calculated massacres," chief of which was the Deir Yassin Tragedy.



While Menachem Begin often boasted of the evil deeds of his gang, he failed, however, to tell us that in Deir Yassin, his gang butchered the women and the children and the cows of that village. He did not tell us that pregnant women were ripped open with bayonets, that little children were cut to pieces under the eyes of their mothers and that the few who survived, purposely left to disseminate the news, were stripped of their clothes, herded into open trucks and paraded through the Jewish quarters of Jerusalem to be subjected to the insults of the Jewish mob and were forced to submit to being photographed stark naked.

CONDEMNATION OF GREAT BRITAIN

All this happened before May 15th, 1948, while Great Britain was still responsible for the security of the country entrusted to its care by the Mandate and by the United Nations; and while British troops, who were often less than a mile away from the scene of the massacre, did not lift a finger to stop this butchery or take any action against the culprits. This condemnation is already re-

corded in "A Study of History" by Arnold Toynbee, a British subject:

"While the direct responsibility for the calamity that overtook the Palestinian Arabs in A.D. 1948 was on the heads of the Zionist Jews who seized a lebensraum for themselves in Palestine by force of arms in that year, a heavy load of indirect, yet irreducible, responsibility was on the heads of the people of the United Kingdom; for the Jews would not have had in A.D. 1948 the opportunity to conquer an Arab country in which they had amounted to no more than an inconsiderable minority in A.D. 1918, if, during the intervening thirty years, the power of the United Kingdom had not been exerted continuously to make possible the entry of Jewish immigrants into Palestine, contrary to the will, in spite of the protests and without regard to the forebodings of the Arab inhabitants of the country who in A.D. 1948, were duly to become the victims of this long pursued British Policy."

GENERAL GLUBB ALSO CENSURES BRITAIN

British responsibility towards the inhabitants of Palestine should have ended on the 15th of May 1948. Hundreds of Arabs were killed by the Jewish terrorists and half of the refugees left Palestine before that date. Even Lieutenant General Sir John Bagot Glubb, on page 73 of his book "A Soldier With The Arabs," admitted that his Government did not meet its obligation. He said, "I could not myself avoid the feeling, that the British in Palestine should have done more to keep order until the Mandate ended."

LORD MONTGOMERY CENSURES HIS GOVERNMENT

The British Government was condemned not only because it did not meet its obligation towards the Palestinian Arabs, but also for the policy it adopted towards the Zionist terrorists. This view is supported by Lord Montgomery, British Chief of the Imperial General Staff at the time, who wrote in his "Memoirs" the following

"The High Commissioner seemed to think that provided we took no executive action against lawlessness, the Jewish Agency and the Haganah, would suppress it. He also reckoned that we could not stop lawlessness by offensive action, and that if we tried to do so, we merely annoy the Jews and make matters worse. In other words we could no longer govern Palestine except by sufferance of the Jews."

Lord Montgomery continues to say:

"... I challenged the existing policy in Palestine from the point of view of the right use of the army! 100,000 men were being stationed there, they were suffering casualties at the

average rate of two a day and they were not allowed to take appropriate action against their assailants. The army was being misused, a great portion of it being employed on purely defensive tasks; **the only way it could stamp out terrorism was to take the offensive against the terrorists, and this was not allowed. We had in fact surrendered the initiative to them.**"

FIELD MARSHAL MONTGOMERY

Chief of the Imperial General Staff, who tried to influence his Government to take action against the terrorists and against the "Jewish Agency" which sponsored them, but failed.



These are the words of the Commander in Chief of the British army! Can there be a greater treachery than that!

FOUR WAVES OF EXPULSIONS AND FLIGHTS

THE FIRST WAVE

Records show that only 60,000 refugees had left Palestine before the Deir Yassin massacre. A good number of these were non-Palestinians who were employed by the Mandatory Government and in the different companies and trades. They lost their jobs because of the termination of the mandate and consequently returned to their native lands. Admittedly, there was a small number of Palestinians who, unable to control their nerves, took refuge in the neighboring countries, pending the cessation of the troubles.

THE SECOND WAVE

Those who fled between the 9th of April 1948 (the date of the Deir Yassin massacre) and the 15th of May 1948 (the end of the British Mandate) - the period during which the Zionists carried out their planned and calculated massacres - amounted to 300,000. During this period, towns and villages were occupied by the illegal Jewish forces and the Arab inhabitants were either killed or expelled. Deir Yassin was attacked on the 9th of April. Nassridin, near Tiberias, was attacked on 14th of April; on the 22nd of April, Haifa was

occupied while British troops, who, suddenly evacuated their positions, were parading the Haifa harbor in great numbers; Beisan, on the 11th of May and Acre on the 14th of May 1948. In new Jerusalem, most of the Arab quarters were occupied before the termination of the mandate, and on the 14th of May, 1948, a fearful battle was fought on the walls of the Holy City in which the writer took part. The Hagana loud-speaker continued to blare out "Take pity on your wives and children and get out of this blood bath."

THE OCCUPATION OF HAIFA—BEFORE THE TERMINATION OF THE MANDATE

Both Haifa and Jaffa were occupied during this period - 9th of April to the 15th of May, 1948. The "Fall Of Haifa," an article by Prof. Walid Khalidi, published in the Middle East Forum of the American University of Beirut, Lebanon, of December 1959, gives a full description of how the Jewish terrorists occupied the city. It is essential for every interested person to read this statement.

Professor Khalidi begins his research paper in the following words:

"The all-out Zionist attack on Haifa began in the early morning of Wednesday, April 21st, 1948, and ended on the following day with the expulsion of some 50,000 Arab inhabitants and the fall of the city into Zionist hands. The attack was not an isolated phenomenon, nor was it a Zionist reaction to any local Arab initiative. It was an important phase of the new Zionist offensive which was to pave the way for the proclamation of the state of Israel."

BRITISH TROOPS WITHDREW FROM HAIFA BEFORE END OF MANDATE

At that time Great Britain was still responsible for law and order in the country. Shamelessly, however, Great Britain failed in its obligation and she withdrew her forces from Haifa before the termination of the Mandate, thus helping the Jewish terrorists to occupy the city. Regarding this withdrawal, Prof. Khalidi writes:

"Although both Jews and Arabs were formally informed of the withdrawal within an hour of each other on the morning of Wednesday, April 21st, yet there is evidence to indicate that the Zionists knew of the British withdrawal well ahead of the Arabs. They had assembled from all over the country a striking force above the Arab quarters and the moment the British withdrew, they occupied the positions which the British had held and launched from there a series of attacks which were clearly based upon the assumption of the absence of the British from certain positions and their withdrawal to others."

As to the treachery of the General Officer Commanding, North Sector, Palestine, General H. C. Stockwell, there is not the slightest

doubt; but whether he was ordered from London to do it or he acted on his own initiative, has never been determined.

This British treachery was verified in "The Jewish Observer" of 13 November 1953, when Jon Kimche, its Editor says:

"They - (the Arabs) - avow that the British told the Jews but not the Arabs that they proposed to evacuate the major part of Haifa. I always thought this charge was an Arab excuse or Arab propaganda. I now know that this version is correct: they were not told."



MAJOR GENERAL

H. C. STOCKWELL

G.O.C., North Sector - Palestine

Responsible for the treacherous British withdrawal from Haifa, thus exposing Arab quarters to the assault of Jewish terrorists.

Thus the Arab quarters were placed under fire of the Jewish illegal forces. Farid Saad, Chairman of the Arab National Committee, according to Prof. Khalidi, "appealed to them (the British) to put an end to the massacre of innocent Arab women and children, particularly, because it was their duty to do so. Saad's appeals went unheeded."

In "Seven Fallen Pillars" Jon Kimche, touring the Arab Sukh (market) in Haifa that day says:

"It was the first and only occasion during all the Palestine troubles on which armed Jews and British soldiers worked together in complete harmony. The Arabs had left in great panic; I walked later through the Sukh (the bazaar) and saw the state of disorder in which they had left their homes, often not bothering to pick up silver and valuables which they could have carried in their hands."

What does this "complete harmony between armed Jews and British soldiers" mean but a treacherous agreement between the

attackers and the defenders against the defenseless Arab inhabitants of Haifa whom they slaughtered!!

Does this tell that the Palestine Arabs left their homes voluntarily?

THE OCCUPATION OF THE ARAB TOWN OF JAFFA

Notwithstanding a written agreement, which was concluded between the two parties in the Office of the British District Commissioner, in which Jaffa was declared an open town; and no sooner the British troops withdrew than the terrorists attacked.

John Kimche in his book "Seven Fallen Pillars," writes: "The great bombardment was started with 3 inch mortar which the Irgun had captured a few weeks earlier in a raid on a British camp in which an officer and four soldiers had been killed. This bombardment started a panic among the Jaffa Arabs. The remaining 20,000 started to leave the city by boat and by road. "The Irgun activities in Jaffa also extended to yet another field. For the first time in the still undeclared war a Jewish force commenced to loot in wholesale fashion. At first the young Irgunists pillaged only dresses, blouses and ornaments for their girl friends. But this discrimination was soon abandoned. Everything that was movable was carried from Jaffa—furniture, carpets, pictures, crockery and pottery, jewelry and cutlery. The occupied parts of Jaffa were stripped, and yet another traditional military characteristic raised its ugly head. What could not be taken away was smashed. Windows, pianos, fittings and lamps went in an orgy of destruction."

All these occupations, expulsions and atrocities took place during the period between the 9th of April and the 15th of May 1948, when the British High Commissioner for Palestine and British troops numbering, according to Field Marshal Montgomery, 100,000 strong, were still responsible to keep law and order in Palestine and entrusted with the safety of the population.

THE UNITED NATIONS AND ISRAELI ATROCITIES

These atrocities and expulsions shocked the United Nations. The Security Council resolved to re-assess the Partition resolution of the 29th November 1947 and to send Count Folke Bernadotte to "promote a peaceful adjustment of the future situation of Palestine."

Count Bernadotte arrived in Palestine in May 1948, and presented to the Arab States and the Israelis suggestions for a settlement of the Palestine dispute.

In his first report to the United Nations, Count Bernadotte severely criticized the Israeli Provisional Government for not allowing the refugees to go back home and he condemned the acts of violence of the terrorists.

THE ASSASSINATION OF COUNT FOLKE BERNADOTTE

The Jewish terrorists, however, would not permit any man to stand in their way or interfere in their plans even if he were the Mediator of the United Nations. On the 17th of September 1948, members of the Irgun terrorist gang stopped his car on the streets of the Holy City and in cold blood, cowardly murdered him and his assistant, Colonel Andre Serot. They were shot to death and not hanged on the trees as in the case of the two British sergeants a year before, nor cut in pieces as in the massacre of women and children in Deir Yassin, five months earlier.

MASSACRES BEFORE ARAB ARMIES ENTERED PALESTINE

These tragic incidents took place before one Arab soldier set foot in Palestine. The Arab armies who were accused by the Zionist Jews to be the main cause of the Arab refugee problem, were not there during this period when, because of British default, they should have been there, if not to have prevented, at least to have minimized the tragedy. But British troops would not allow their entry in order to facilitate Zionist occupation of as many towns and villages as possible before the Arab armies could intervene. In fact, British troops were encouraging the Arab inhabitants to leave by supplying them with transportation as in Tiberias, Haifa and Jaffa.

WHY DID THE ARAB ARMIES ENTER PALESTINE ?

Why the Arab armies entered Palestine is also explained in "Seven Fallen Pillars" by Jon Kimche, page 233, where he says:

"For though it has become a habit among Israelis and pro-Zionists to assume that there was nothing but evil hatred behind the Arab decision to go to war against Israel, and that the Arab explanation that they came to save their brethren from attack by the terrorists was a cheap excuse for the benefit of those who cared to believe it, it must be stressed that there was great and very real Arab concern for the fate of the Palestine Arabs. This concern reached fever-heat when the British information was passed on that the terrorists were becoming the decisive factor in the Jewish armed forces."

Finally, the Arab armies did enter Palestine after the 15th of May 1948, to save their Arab brethren, but, unfortunately, it was too late.

Nevertheless, late as they were, the Arab armies had an initial victory over the terrorists who were pushed back to the wall. But the United States and Great Britain, through the Security Council, forced the First Truce which was surprisingly limited to four weeks with the stipulation that no arms were to be sold to either side.

During these four weeks, the Arabs kept their pledge, but the Zionists treacherously smuggled in huge quantities of arms of all types from Czechoslovakia which had become Communist, and brought in a number of American volunteers with airplanes from the United States which had effectively changed the military position of the two combatants when fighting was resumed at the end of the four weeks.

THE THIRD WAVE

The third wave of expulsion, about 150,000 refugees, took place between the 9th and 18th of July 1948, when fighting was resumed after the First Truce. As just stated, this First Truce was enforced by the Security Council at a time when the movements of the Jewish terrorists had, already, been paralyzed by the Arab armies. But when the battle was resumed on the 9th of July 1948, the terrorists were then armed to the teeth with Czechoslovakian arms and with American volunteer planes. With this advantage, more ruthless than before, they attacked on all sides.

A large number of this wave fled from Lydda and Ramleh, which were occupied by the Jews on the 12th of July, 1948. Both of these towns were included in the Arab State under the Partition plan. Why and how these people fled, is explained in General Glubb's book, "A Soldier With The Arabs." It says:

"No sooner were the enemy in the towns than they set about an intensive house to house search, all men of military age being arrested and removed to concentration camps. The Israeli vans fitted with loud speakers drove through the streets, ordering all the remaining inhabitants to leave within half an hour. Houses were broken into and women sufficiently roughly handled to give point to the warning to be clear of the town in that time."

"Perhaps thirty thousand people or more, almost entirely women and children, snatched up what they could and fled from their homes across the open fields. The Israeli forces, not only arrested men of military age, they also commandeered all means of transport. It was a blazing day in July in the coastal plains. The temperature was about a hundred degrees in the shade. It was ten miles across open hill country, much of it ploughed, part of it stony fallow covered with thorn bushes, to the nearest Arab village of Beit Sira. Nobody will ever know how many children died."

This description was given by no other than Glubb Pasha, who was accused of betraying the Arabs and giving Lydda and Ramleh to the Jews, in accordance with orders received from London.

THE FOURTH WAVE

The fourth wave of refugees, over 175,000 Arabs, took place during the Second Truce between the 15th of October 1948 and the 24th of February, 1949 - the date on which the Rhodes-Armistice agreement between Israel and Egypt was signed. The Zionists violated the truce and attacked the Egyptian forces who were keeping their pledge in accordance with truce conditions. They attacked by air, by ground troops, and by the garrisons of the Jewish colonies behind the Egyptian lines. The Palestinian Arabs in that area withdrew with the Egyptian army, thus 175,000 more became refugees. Most of these settled in the Gaza Sector, a strip of land, five miles by twenty-five, which now shelters over 300,000 Palestinian refugees. The United Nations intervened and stopped the fighting on the 22nd of October, 1948; and although the United Nations resolved that both parties should return to their positions prior to the attack on the 15th of October, it did nothing to enforce its resolution and the Israelis remained in occupation of that vast territory until this day.

EXPULSION OF THE ARABS HAS NO TIME LIMIT

But this was not the end of the tragedy. Sir John Bagot Glubb in "A Soldier With The Arabs," on page 211 says:

"Meanwhile the refugees continued to pour in. The Israelis were now deliberately driving out all Arabs, a process assisted now and again by the usual 'calculated massacre.' On October 31st, United Nations observers reported that the Israelis had killed thirty women and children at Dawaima, West of Hebron. It would be an exaggeration to claim that great numbers were massacred. But just enough were killed, or roughly handled, to make sure that all the civilian population took flight, thereby leaving more and more land vacant for future Jewish settlement . . ."

ARMISTICE AGREEMENTS SIGNED BUT VIOLATED BY ISRAELIS

Fighting was stopped and armistice agreements between the Arab States (on the borders) and the Israelis were signed and by July 20th, 1949, all was supposed to be quiet.

Then what happened?

Again General Glubb describes what happened in these words: "At the beginning, many refugees went back innocently and unarmed. None, I believe, in those days crossed the armistice line in order to fight or injure the Jews. The majority went to rescue some of their belongings, or to look for missing relatives. The Israelis were ruthless. Many of these unfortunate people were shot on sight by Israeli posts or patrols, without even the formality of arrest or questioning. Cases occurred of farmers

going out to plough their land, and being shot dead by Israeli patrols as they drove their ploughs across their own fields. The farmers had not realized that, owing to a line drawn on a map somewhere, half of their fields were no longer their own."

ATTACKS ON ARAB FRONT-LINE VILLAGES

But were the Israelis ruthless only with those innocent Arabs who tried to cross the imaginary lines which separated them from their ancestral lands? Far from it. Their successive brutal attacks on Arab front-line villages shocked the world. The Qibya massacre on the 14th of October 1953 where the whole village was bombed at night on the heads of its men, women and children, killing 42 and wounding fifteen; the bombing of Falama village on January the 22nd and again on January the 29th, 1954; the Nahhaline massacre on March the 29th 1954; the Fukin assault and others that followed soon after; the Israeli invasion of Sinai and the Gaza sector of Palestine where more than 800 young Palestinian Arabs, according to the report of the Director of U.N.R.W.A., were murdered in cold blood—all these atrocities have gone down in history to show that Israel, which was recognized by former President Truman five minutes after it declared itself, is not worthy of statehood.



THE QUIBYA MASSACRE

An Arab front-line village, unprovocatively was attacked and destroyed by Israeli armed forces on the night of 14th October, 1953 leaving 42 men, women and children dead, and 15 wounded.

The Security Council of the United Nations "condemned" Israel for every one of these aggressions, but as in all previous massacres, the Israelis were never punished for crimes they committed.

ANOTHER ISRAELI METHOD OF EXPULSION BY DISCRIMINATION

Another Israeli method of forcing more Arabs to leave Palestine is by treating the Arabs now living in Israel as Second Class citizens, restricting their movements, putting them under military rule, expropriating their lands, destroying their villages, terrorizing them and making life unbearable for them. Actually, the Israelis want them to leave in order to give their homes and lands to new Jewish immigrants. The late Prof. Judah Magnes, President of the Hebrew University, wrote the following in "Ichud" of February, 1953:

"The Government's policy embitters the Arab population and makes their lives very difficult. It incites opposition, radicalism, and finally hate of the government and state. But it also poisons the lives of the Jews, especially those of our younger generation. They see in the example of the military Government discrimination of man against man, because of race, religion and nationality. Such a policy is in basic contradiction and opposition to the Jewish tradition and to the declaration and promises of the Jewish people during the time when it itself was a persecuted and homeless minority. **It will not earn us honor and love among the nations of the world and will not bring nearer the peace which we so much need.**"

ISRAELIS MORE BRUTAL THAN NAZIS THE KAFR KASEM MASSACRE

As an example of Israel's massacre of its Arab population, we reproduce here the statement sent to the International Secretariat of the Third Body, 12 High St.-London, by the movement's affiliated body in Tel-Aviv. (The officers and the bulk of its membership are Jews). The massacre took place on the day Israel invaded Egypt.

*"On 29th October, 1956, the day on which the attack had started, an Officer came to Kafr-Kasem at 4:30 p.m., and ordered the Mukhtar (head of the village) to inform the villagers that a curfew will start at 5:00 p.m. The Mukhtar said that he would inform the villagers who were within the village, but what about those who were working outside the village, in Petach Tikva and in other places. The Officer said, for this matter I am responsible. The Mukhtar and other people, went from house to house and informed the villagers about the curfew, and about the fixed hour, and the villagers went to their homes. But the workers who worked outside the village were intercepted on their way home by armed guards. There were two such guards, one was standing near the Home of the Aged at Ras El-Ain. By this way the workers of Patach-Tikva return home and they return usually on bicycles. Every one of those workers who was caught by a guard was taken aside to a lane and shot. If a group came, all were killed. The second guard was standing not far from the village school, at the entrance of the village and by the order of the Officer who was in command of this guard, the security men took hold of the villagers who returned that way, arranged them in groups of 5-10 and shot them. Those who were not killed were shot again and again till

they were killed. In these groups were also children aged 9-10 years, who were sent to call their fathers to come home. To this place also came a truck carrying about 15 girls and women who worked in the nearby orange groves. The guard stopped the car, seized the driver by the neck, dragged him down, and shot several bullets through the head. The women began crying and the security men shot at them and killed 7 of them. The remaining women begged for their lives. The Officer ordered the firing to cease and contacted somebody on wireless. After about 10 minutes he gave the order that the remaining women be shot; all were killed except one who had been wounded in the chest and remained alive. To this place also came a woman not an inhabitant of Kafar Kasem, carrying in her arm a child aged two months. The guard shot at the woman and then at the child and both were killed, the child remaining in the arms of the mother. In this state they were brought to the police station of Kafar Saba and so they were buried. The number killed were 49 and the number wounded 13."

" . . . Thus, in an atmosphere of bogus sanctity and mock legality, aggression was proclaimed moral in one case and place alone. History knows no instance of aggression so strange or shameless."

The question may well be asked, "Have these culprits been punished," No - nor were the assassins of Count Bernadotte and his companion.

EXPULSION OF THE PALESTINIAN ARABS BY THE ISRAELIS CONTINUES

The Near East Christian Council Committee in Jerusalem, Jordan, in its "News Item," No. 23, of October, 1959, stated the following:

"ADDITIONAL AZAZME REFUGEES FROM ISRAEL"

"On October 6, 1959, the Egyptian-Israeli Mixed Armistice Commission condemned Israel for their punitive treatment of the Bedouins in Israel whereby an estimated 354 members of the Azazme tribe were forced to flee from their ancestral grazing lands and seek refuge in the mountains of Sinai. The resolution states "that the Israeli troops have committed hostile acts against these bedouins, which included the killing of some bedouins, burning their tents and depriving them of their property, as a result of which the Bedouins were compelled to flee into U.A.R. territory" and "that those actions were carried out in a harsh and cruel way contrary to accepted humanitarian consideration."



DAVID BEN-GURION

Believes in Force—of the Hitler type—was chairman of The Jewish Agency in Palestine which sponsored and financed the three terrorists gangs. As Prime Minister, he continued his "Nazi-like policy" against the Arabs.

"On the assumption that an Israeli soldier was killed by a Bedouin the government of Israel took the following action as reported by United Nations military observers on September 25, 1959. During the previous week Sheikh Muslah el-Ueridi of the Azazme sub-tribe Subhiin was arrested. The members of his tribe were told to harvest their grain. When their grain was collected the Israeli soldiers forced them to pile their tents on the grain and the whole was set on fire. Their cattle and personal property were confiscated. Then they were harrassed by patrols firing on them from cars and airplanes as they sought to escape into Egyptian territory. Salem Faraj Suleiman, age 30, was shot and killed during these operations after he had escaped across the border."

"Although readily available for the public, surprisingly little of this careful investigation and condemnation of Israel has appeared in the world press. This new aggression against a nomadic people who have had from time immemorial well-recognized grazing rights in the area has produced 350 new refugees who according to the report, 'are seeking or will seek refuge in Jordan and Egypt'. The report goes on to say that the people questioned, 'showed clear signs of suffering and hardship. They were hungry and dressed in rags and tatters. They had absolutely nothing with them except the clothes they wore. They appeared drawn and emaciated'."

"Isaiah 6:11. Lord, How Long!"

This was the more recent expulsion of the Palestinian Arabs as reported by Mr. A. Williard Jones, Executive Secretary of the Near East Christian Council Committee in Jerusalem-Jordan.

CONCLUSION

Israel is a militant Zionist state created by the Christian West in Palestine. The Christian and Moslem East was and still is very much opposed to its creation.

Zionism, as Nazism, thrives on prejudice, discrimination and destruction, adheres to force and is ruthless. It has no friend or foe but has an objective which justifies all means. In Palestine, the Zionists first sabotaged their British benefactors who, with their bayonets brought the Zionists into the country. Hence, their mean record with the authors of the Balfour Declaration is found in the British Command Paper of 1946, No. 6873, published in our last issue "The Activities of the Hagana, Irgun Zvei Leumi and Stern Bands."

In this pamphlet, we placed on record only a fraction of the evil deeds the Zionists have committed against the Palestine Arabs, the owners of Palestine, whom they have been since 1917, trying to destroy. With the inexhaustible help of the Christian West, the Zionists almost succeeded in annihilating the Palestine Arab population. They massacred thousands of them and expelled the majority from their homes and homeland as we have described in this treatise. Those Arabs who remained, the Zionists have been trying to eliminate in one way or another.

But, fortunately, it did not all go well for the Zionists as they had carefully planned. The Palestine Arab refugees have not been settled in the Arab world as the Zionists had hoped for; and the Arab people have determinedly refused to accept militant Zionism - which is quite different from Judaism - in their midst. And a life and death struggle is now raging between the Arab people and the Zionists who are still being supported by the Christian West.

The battle against Zionism will be won when the misguided Christian West and the misled world-Jewry will know what actually militant Zionism is and what its ambitions are. The Lavon Case has enhanced this information and Ben Gurion, himself, is now telling the story. The ugly truth about Zionism will soon be known.

THE EXPULSION OF THE PALESTINE ARABS AFTER THE ISRAELI WAR OF AGGRESSION OF THE 5th JUNE 1967

Zionist tactics in expelling the Palestine Arabs from the West Bank and the Gaza Sector in 1967, were no different from the tactics they employed in 1948. Again, every means of terror was used to force the Arab population to evict their homes and camps and flee for their lives. Consequently, history will, no doubt, place the Israeli invaders of Palestine on the same criminal level as their once persecutor — Hitler of the Nazis. Arnold Toynbee, the great British historian, has already done so.

A more detailed work on the subject will soon be published. However, we think it is sufficient, for the present, to write on the tactics the Israelis used to reach their objective. Examples of their technique were published by L. Emmett Holt, Jr., M.D., President of the "American Middle East Rehabilitation, Inc. (AMER) in his report to his Committee which he made during his visit to the Middle East 23rd - 28th July, 1967.

As Dr. Holt is an American gentleman of reputation and integrity and heads a humane organization, we seize the opportunity of placing on record his observations on the subject which, we believe, are sufficient to expose the evil intentions of the Zionists and the dangerous program they have in store for the indigenous inhabitant of Palestine.

Dr. Holt writes:

"The policy of the Israeli military government was to encourage an exodus from west Jordan by several techniques: (1) loud speaker announcements that personal safety could not be guaranteed for those who remained and that buses were available to take them to the river; (2) visits of Israeli soldiers to various houses to encourage evacuation. Residents who failed to comply were told in some instances that a gas attack was imminent and that their only chance of surviving it was to make the building as air tight as possible. This advice was followed in some instances but there was no gas attack. In the refugee camps a different technique was employed. A soldier would appear and demand surrender of all arms. When no arms appeared 10 men were lined up and it was announced "unless you give us the arms these men will be shot". There were no arms produced so the men were taken around a corner where no one could see; ten shots were heard and the men were spirited away somewhere in a truck, supposedly but not actually shot. It was not a very effective device.

DESTRUCTION OF HOUSES

More effective stimulants to exit in Jerusalem and the border villages were the destruction of dwellings in the early post-war period. A block of refugee occupied houses in the old city was levelled to make a square in front of the Wailing Wall, with no concern for the individuals living there. There was almost complete destruction in the early

post-war period of border villages — two along on Hebron front, two in the Latroun area north of Jerusalem and Qalkilya, the largest one (population about 12,000). Some 820 houses out of about 1,100 were bulldozed. And then the policy was changed and the military overruled by higher governmental authority.

UNRWA set up a tent village just outside of Qalkilya but the dispossessed townspeople wouldn't go there. They said, "we are going to sleep in the ruins of our houses; they can put us out if they want to". Reportedly, that is what they are doing now. Water pipes in the villages had been broken and there was no water in the ruined houses. There was a spring 15 feet outside the border of the town which was in Israeli territory. They were not allowed to go that far to get water and had to walk half a mile in the other direction. The UNRWA staff have been given access to the destroyed villages with the exception of one in the Latroun area, no reason for their exclusion there being given. I tried to go to Qalkilya, but the necessary permission did not come through.

I was informed that the Israeli government would like voluntary agencies to take over the task of rebuilding the villages they have destroyed, but do not plan to do it themselves. The Swedes are rebuilding the two villages along the Hebron border. At Qalkilya, the present indication was that the people of Qalkilya will be **allowed** to rebuild their old houses themselves. There is lots of building material in the rubble and perhaps the government will supply some cement and plaster.

JERICHO — A GHOST TOWN

I made a trip to Jericho — a ghost town now — and to the Allenby Bridge which was still carrying refugees out, loaded with all the personal possessions they could manage. It is still unsettled what the policy will be about readmitting any of these unfortunate people. There are many families who want to be reunited, but red tape has snarled forward movement.

The negotiations for return of the refugees to the West Bank are being carried on by the International Red Cross which consults first with one side, then with the other. By this means an agreement was reached but when the final text appeared from the Israeli side — instead of being presented on plain white paper it appeared on a sheet with a star of David and "State of Israel" in large letters — also fine lines of Hebrew characters. The Jordanese refused to sign. In subsequent negotiations it was agreed that the document be put on Red Cross stationery but there was no agreement about the elimination of the Hebrew characters. As far as I know, the outcome is still in dispute and it is not clear whether any appreciable repatriation to the west will occur. If it does, it will present UNRWA with a major transport and food distribution program and a reopening of closed camps in the west and abandonment of some in the east.

GAZA

My last day was spent in Gaza, now easily reached by automobile in two hours from Jerusalem. The town was not too seriously damaged, nor were the camps damaged with one exception. Reportedly the battle was ferocious but fire bombs were apparently not used. The UNRWA staff closed their offices during the fighting, but a number of Arab heroes served as corpsmen and brought the injured to the hospital.

I was told the story of one elderly refugee from one of the camps who with the aid of a pushcart worked continuously and in all brought 80 injured to the hospital, by some miracle escaping injury himself. After the battle he was asked what the agency could do for him and the reply was "Nothing really, but perhaps I could use a couple of extra blankets to keep my family warm next winter". I was reminded of Browning's Herve Riel, the hero of the sea battle of St. Malo, who, when asked what reward he wanted for saving the king's ships, replied, "just one day at home with my wife 'La Belle Aurore'." The result was similar: "This he asked, this he got; nothing more". But perhaps this Gaza hero will get something more".

400,000 MORE REFUGEES

After this report was written, it was ascertained that the Israelis closed the doors of Palestine to most of the Palestinians who fled to the East Bank of the Jordan. In spite of a United Nations resolution demanding their repatriation, the Israelis refused to admit but a few thousand. Four hundred thousand new refugees remained on the East Bank of the Jordan. A detailed pamphlet on this subject which will include the United Nations Resolutions, will soon be published.

EXPULSIONS IN SYRIA, THE U.A.R. AND JORDAN AS RELATED BY W.C.P. (VIENNA, AUSTRIA)

"A Delegation from the World Council of Peace visited Syria, The United Arab Republic and Jordan from 27th September to 10th October 1967, to express the solidarity of the W.C.P. with the populations who are victims of Israeli aggression and to gather evidence of the forcible expulsion of Arabs, the ordeals suffered by the Palestinian refugees and the Israeli crimes".


The Delegation which was led in Syria and the U.A.R. and Jordan by Mr. Ramesh Chandra, Secretary General of the W.C.P. issued a pamphlet on their investigations called "The Truth About The War In The Middle East". The first Chapter of this pamphlet has the following as its title: — **NOT WAR — BUT BARBARISM AND BESTIALITY ON THE RAMPAGE** — by Ramesh Chandra. The following are a few quotations from this pamphlet:

"What we saw was beyond imagination."

"We had expected to see a great deal of misery of the effects of a war which we knew had many awful aspects about it. But what we saw in Syria and then in the United Arab Republic, as the delegation of the World Council of Peace, was beyond anything anyone of us had imagined"

"In Khan Dannun refugee camp, not very far from Damascus, we were told the story of a man named Mohammad El-Kudsi of the village Al-Kushneya. This Arab citizen, with his wife, two teen age daughters and two sons was sitting in his home when the Israeli soldiers entered.

"Why are you still staying here?" they asked. Mohammad El-Kudsi answered: "I am a civilian" The reply came quickly: "Civilian or no civilian, you have no place in this village."

And then came the agony. The invaders asked: "You have two sons and two daughters. Shall we take the sons or shall we take the daughters?"

El-Kudsi asked for time and he consulted together with his family. The boys said immediately that they would go: "Take my sons". We could almost hear the heart beat of the father as he made the terrible choice.

The Israeli soldiers took the two sons out and shot them outside their door, and then they returned and took the girls. Their screams could be heard for a long long while.

This story is not an exception. It was merely one among many that we heard of the way in which the Israeli soldiers acted as they entered the Villages.

EXPULSIONS IN JORDAN

Our investigations in Jordan showed that this high refugee rate proved that Israeli troops had not hesitated to use even the most inhumane methods, and that real psychological warfare had been carried out in Cis-Jordan and is still going on against the Arab population in order to force them to flee.

According to the information we received, this began with the complete destruction of frontier villages and the bombing of camps of the Palestinian refugees from 1948, resulting in mass flight. They were harried by daily air raids and bombs and napalm causing a very large number of dead and wounded.

This was followed by reprisals, which are still quite frequent, to crush the last traces of resistance. Private houses are blown up and destroyed on the pretext that weapons might be concealed there. Young people are combed out and taken to unknown destinations and nothing further is heard of them.

The people spend sleepless nights of terror, listening to rifle fire going on around them everywhere.

Hostages are taken and punitive measures are put into operation against the population if an act of sabotage is carried out somewhere by patriots.

Families are separated, some being taken, others left.

All these methods are so dreadful that the people are obliged to flee, at the end of their physical and mental resistance.


We could continue endlessly, relating all the tragic stories told us spontaneously by the refugees who, crowding around us in the camps, jostle one another to get a chance to put their own case, each more tragic than the other one before."

CONCLUSION

It is now evident that the Zionists want to establish a Zionist Empire, from the Nile to the Euphrates, with as few Arab inhabitants in it as possible as shown in the adjoining map. To secure that, they have been using, according to plan, the most brutal military force in these occupations and evictions. This plan, prompted Count Folke Bernadotte, United Nations Mediator, who was assassinated by the Zionist Irgun terrorist gang in Jerusalem in 1948, to say in his report to the United Nations, the following: "The Jewish State was not born in peace as was hoped for in the resolution of November 29, 1947, but rather in violence and bloodshed."
